OUR PARISHES IN OREGON, Feb., 1933

- Albany: Work begun by E. Doering and served from Mt. Angel by J. A. Duchow at time of District's organization. Served by H. Lossner from Salem, 1900 to 1903. First resident pastor, C. J. Beyerlein 1904 to 1924; since 1924 H. C. Messerli is the pastor. Has church building 40 x 66, built in 1906, Cost--\$2000. Has eight-room parsonage, built in 1908, Cost--\$1400. Teacher A. Klawitter served, with one interruption, from 1918 to 1926. Became self-sustaining in 1905. Souls--250; Communicants--165; Voters--46.
- Bend. Work begun by W. F. Georg in 1923 and served by him till 1925; by J. Kempf 1925 to 1926; by J. C. R. Schmidt since 1926. Has church building 24 x 32, built in 1926; Cost--\$1500. Has parsonage, four rooms, acquired under contract in 1931, Cost--\$1600. Souls--76; Communicants--42; Voters--13.
- Burns: Begun by W. F. Georg in 1926 and served by him until 1927; by H. A. Kahle from Nampa 1927 to 1928; by J. C. R. Schmidt from Bend in 1928; again by Georg, 1929 to 1930; since 1930 by present pastor, C. Wildermut. Has Chapel-Parsonage, built in 1930, Cost--\$4000. Souls--70; Communicants--44; Voters--17. Seneca, Oregon, begun by Wildermut, is a preaching station.
- Cornelius: Begun by E. Doering in 1881, served by him until 1887; (Blooming) served by M. Claus from 1887 to 1889; by H. C. Paul, 1889 to 1900; by L. Staebe, 1900 until 1930; since 1930 by E. W. Hinrichs. Old church built 1883; new church, 78 x 38, built in 1923; Cost--\$12500. Has nine-room parsonage, built in 1895; also teacherage, and school building. School attended by 21 pupils at present; Pastors taught before 1909. Teacher H. Ruecker served from 1909 to 1926; Miss Leder, 1925 to 1926; since 1926 the present teacher, R. P. Moeller. S: 338; C: 219; V: 59. Celebrated Golden Anniversary in 1932.
- Corvallis: Explored by E. Doering, 1902; begun by C. J. Beyerlein and served by him from Albany from 1904 to 1910; served by C. Hereth from 1910 to 1918; by E. J. A. Probst since 1918. Has church building, built in 1907, 30 x 55, Cost--\$1800 plus donated labor. Has a nine-room parsonage, built in 1912, Cost--\$1800 (About) Has well-equipped school in church basement, attended by 22 pupils; teachers were Pastor Hereth, 1910 to 1913; R. M. Beyerlein, 1913 to 1918; R. Brandt since 1931; the pastor taught in the interim. Celebrated its Silver Anniversary in 1930. S: 204; C: 142; V: 39. Blodgett is a preaching station. Self-sustaining since 1911.

Eugene: Explored by E. Doering at time of District's Organization begun by C. Hereth in 1916; served by G. Theis, 1918 to 1923; by R. G. Trautman, 1923 to 1928; since 1928 by M. P. Simon. Has church building, 44 x 60, acquired in 1920, and a seven-room parsonage, Total cost--\$4500.  
S: 250; C: 84; V: 23.  
Goshen and Lone Cedar, begun by Simon, are preaching stations.

Hillsboro: E. Doering here already in 1906; begun by E. W. Luecke in 1916, and served by him until 1919; by P. Schaus, 1919 to 1926; since 1926 by Geo. Reule.  
Acquired church building, 30 x 60, in 1926; Cost--\$1600.  
Built parsonage, eight rooms, in 1930; Cost--\$3200.  
Became self-sustaining in 1928.  
S: 168; C: 127; V: 34.

Hood River: Explored by E. Doering in 1902; H. J. Kolb to Hood River in 1904; served until 1906; by E. Druckenmiller from 1906 to 1908; by W. F. Suhr, 1909 to 1910; by C. F. Schulenberg, 1910 to 1913; by W. Biel, from Vancouver, in 1913; intermittently by E. Doering, 1914 to 1920; since 1920 by P. Hilgendorf, in the city. Church acquired in 1920; Parsonage acquired in 1926; Cost--\$4000.

Klamath Falls: Explored by E. Doering in 1902; served by him intermittently before 1917; by Geo. Engel in 1905; by F. Zehe 1911 to 1912, from Norway; by M. Rossman, 1917 to 1919; by Student C. Matthies from 1920 to 1921; by H. H. Meyer, 1921 to 1923; since 1923 by G. W. Hoffman.  
Has Chapel-Parsonage, 30 x 44, built in 1926; Cost--\$7000.  
S: 113; C: 71; V: 25.  
Preaching stations are Lake View, and Hildebrand.

Lebanon: Begun by C. J. Beyerlein in 1911; and served by him until 1913; by C. F. Schulenburg, 1913 to 1928; by O. Schedler, 1928 to 1932; since 1932 by R. Heins.  
Has church building, 45 x 30, acquired in 1912; Cost--\$1400.  
S: 105; C: 63; V: 15.  
Preaching station; Sweet Home.

Marshfield: Begun by Norwegian Synod in 1908; served 1911 to 1912 by F. Zehe from Norway; by A. F. Fergin, 1926 to 1929; since 1929 by G. W. Mathiasen.  
Has Chapel, 50 x 24, and six-room parsonage, acquired in 1913, Cost--\$2000.  
S: 100; C: 22; V: 8. (and Lakeside.  
Preaching stations: North Bend, Myrtle Point, Larson Inlet,

Medford: Mentioned already in 1899, as places looked up by E. Doering (Grants Pass) had been served by J. W. Witte in 1892; by G. Engel (and Ashland) from Salem in 1906; active work begun by W. F. Georg in 1921 and served by him until 1922; by R. Trautman, 1922 to 1923; by G. W. Hoffman from Klamath Falls, 1923 to 1924; since 1924 by H. H. Young.  
Has combination Chapel-parsonage, 46 x 33, built in 1931, Cost--\$5500.  
S: 127; C: 64; V: 17.  
Before 1931 Ashland was the residence of the missionary; Grants Pass begun by H. H. Young in 1925 is now being served from Medford--Grants Pass has a Chapel, Cost about \$800.

Mt. Angel: Begun by E. Doering, and served by him until 1890; by G.E.Meyer 1890 to 1895; by Doering, as vacancy pastor, 1895 to 1898; by J.A.Duchow 1898 to 1906; by H.J.Kolb, 1907 to 1912; by F.Zehe, 1912 to 1928; since 1928 by F. Dobberfuhl.  
Has church, 49 x 30, (second) and eight-room parsonage since 1892 (Remodeled).  
Has school building, 30 x 20, adequately equipped, not now in operation. Pastors were the teachers.  
S: 173; C: 130; V: 42.

Oregon City: Begun by W.F.Georg in 1921, and served by him for a time; served by R.G.Messerli since 1921.  
Has church building, 28 x 36, Cost--\$1275.  
Has school, 24 x 34 (Addition--10 x 32) adequately equipped, established in 1928; 58 pupils enrolled; supported by Mission Funds. Teachers beside the pastor, Student F. Janssen, 1930 to 1931; since 1931, Teacher E.Dobberfuhl.  
S: 200; C: 100; V: 25.

Portland (Zion): Begun by E.Doering in 1881, served by him until 1894; by A.H.Poppe, 1894 to 1898; by W.H.Behrens, 1898 to 1909; since 1909 by H.H.Koppelman.  
Has church, 35 x 75, with school room in basement; built in 1890; Cost--\$7000.  
Has nine-room parsonage, built in 1893. Cost--\$975.  
Teachers were C.P.M.Markworth, 1899 to 1910; P.Noennig, 1910 to 1915; P.Hillman, 1915 to 1931; since 1931, H.Riekenberg.  
(Teaches at Lents, Portland, since 1933)  
S: 331; C: 258; V: 48.

Portland (Trinity): Work begun by E.Doering in 1888; in 1889 J.W.Theiss became the pastor of the newly organized congregation and served to 1893; by J.W.Witte, 1893 to 1897; by Theo. Fleckenstein, 1897 to 1901; by W. Lüssenhop 1901 to 1906; since 1906 by J.A.Rimbach.  
Built its present brick-veneer church, 80 x 46, in 1920; Cost--\$30,000. Eight-room parsonage acquired in 1923; Cost--\$5250;  
Has two-room school building, 72 x 36, fully equipped, built in 1903; 67 pupils are attending; Teachers were J.H.Schroeder, 1901 to 1905; R.F.Kuhnau, since 1903; O.Steege, 1905 to 1916; A.Buescher, since 1916.  
S: 470; C: 362; V: 80.  
Celebrated 25th Anniversary in December, 1915.

Portland (Emmanuel): Work begun by Prof. Sylwester and J.A.Rimbach, in 1908; served by H.C.Ebeling since 1908.  
Has church building with an equipped school-room in basement, school not in operation at present. O.P.Rausch served as teacher from 1920 to 1925.  
S: 235; C: 150; V: 35.

SE Portland, Lents (Calvary): Begun by W.F.Georg in 1925, and served by him till 1926; served by E.Becker since 1926. Acquired and remodeled church building in 1928; 24 x 53; Cost--\$3000. School in church basement since 1933; Teacher is H.Riekenberg (Together with Zion, Portland) S: 143; C: 70; V: 15.

Portland, St.Johns (Mission): Begun by W.F.Georg, and A.Kolke, in 1931; is being served by A. Kolke. S: 51; C: 17. Vancouver City Mission served in conjunction. This mission was begun by W.F.Georg and J.Westendorf, in 1931; served by J. Westendorf until June, 1932; since then by A.Kolke.--S: 17.

Roseburg: Doering worked here before District was organized; again in 1906; In 1921 W.F.Georg made a new start, and served until 1922; served by R.Trautman, 1922 to 1923; by G.W.Hoffman, 1923 to 1924; by H.H.Young, 1924 to 1925; by R.Trautman from Eugene, 1926 to 1928; by W.F.Georg, from Portland, 1928 to 1929; by H. H.Young, from Ashland and Medford, 1930 to 1931; since 1931, by W.Sylwester. Cottage Grove is a preaching station, formerly served by Doering Bayerlein, Theis, Trautman, and Simon. S: 60; C: 30.

Salem: Doering preached here in 1886, and served until 1890; served by G.E.Meyer from Mt.Angel, 1890 to 1894; by H.Hagist from 1895 to 1897; by H.Lossner, 1900 to 1905; by G.Engel, 1905 to 1910; since 1910 by H.W.Gross. Has church, 30 x 52, built about 1900; Cost--\$1400. Has eight-room parsonage, in 1912, Cost--\$1905. Has school building, fully equipped, 24 x 36; school not now in operation. The following teachers have served for the given terms: Pastor Gross, 1911 to 1915; E.Schabaker, 1915 to 1919; J.Robinson, 1919 to 1921; W.O'Neill, 1923 to 1925; H.L. Ruecker, 1926 to 1930. S: 319; C: 201; V: 50. Self-sustaining in 1911. (Except school in 1929, 1930)

Sandy: Begun by H.Koppelman in 1901, served by him until 1904; by F.Dobberfuhl from 1904 to 1928; since 1928 by F.T.Schoen. Has church, 24 x 46, built during Koppelman's regime; remodeled in 1932. Has eight-room parsonage, in 1905, remodeled, 1929. Has school building, 26 x 36, equipped; school not now in operation. S: 170; C: 80; V: 40. Self-sustaining since 1910. Celebrated 25th Anniversary 1932.

Shefflin: Begun by L.Staebe in 1904 and served by him from Blooming until 1909; by E.W.Luecke, 1909 to 1918; since 1919 by P.Schaus. Has church, 38 x 24, built in 1904. Has eight-room parsonage; built in 1909. School building is well equipped; Enrollment, 25; the pastors did the teaching. S: 130; C: 89; V: 26. Mission Stations: Hayward, served by Luecke, 1909 to 1918; by P.Schaus, 1919 to 1931; since then the members have joined

Forest Grove; begun by E.W.Hinrichs. Prior to 1909, Hayward was served by Ebeling, Gerdes, Stuebe.

Sheridan: Begun by C.J.Heuer in 1897; served by him and H.C.Paul until 1899; by A.Spleiss from Sherwood, 1899 to 1907; by A.Gahl 1909 to 1926; by J.P.Maier, 1926 to 1927; since 1928 by C.F.Schulenburg.

Has church, 50 x 32, built in 1907, Cost--\$2800.

Has six-room parsonage, built in 1909; Cost--\$1200.

S: 136; C: 94; V: 24.

Was self-supporting in 1910, but is now again being subsidized.

Preaching station: McMinnville, begun by J.P.Maier in 1926, and Neskowin, begun by C.F.Schulenburg.

Sherwood: Begun by August Kentner in 1876, organized in 1878; served by Kentner until 1883; by E.Doering, 1884 to 1885; from Portland; by M.Claus, 1885 to 1888, together with Blooming; by H.C.Paul, 1889 to 1892; from Blooming; by C.J.Heuer, 1892 to 1898; by A.Spleiss, 1898 to 1911; by H.J.Kolb, 1911 to 1918; since 1919 by F.Westerkamp.

The present church, which is the third, was built in 1930 and 1931; Size--34 x 78--Brick; Cost--\$7260. Two-manual pipe organ installed in 1931. Eight-room parsonage, built in 1910 for \$1200; well-equipped school, 24 x 42; Enrollment--29; Teachers: J.Koch, 1908 to 1915; E.Barrein, 1916 to 1918; E.Siebrass, 1923 to 1924; A.Schultz, since 1924.

S: 268; C: 172; V: 55.

Congregation celebrated 50th Anniversary Oct. 21, 1928.

Tillamook: Exploration work done in the vicinity by E.Doering and reported at Organization meeting of District; started by W.F.Georg in 1921, and served by him and P.Schaus and Student Daffner 1921 to 1922; served again by W.F.Georg together with F.Westerkamp, 1923 to 1925; first regular pastor, J.P.Maier, since 1925.

Has stucco-tile church, 26 x 52, built in 1928, Cost--\$2500.

Has eight-room parsonage of same material, built in 1930; Cost--\$2500

S: 126; C: 64; V: 16.

Preaching station: Nchalem--has church, 26 x 44, S: 42; C: 20.

#### DEAF-MUTE MISSION, PORTLAND:

Begun by N.Jensen in 1914 and served by him from Los Angeles, California, 1914 to 1917; by G.Gaertner, 1917 to 1919 from Seattle; by J.A.C.Beyer, 1919 to 1922; by G.Gaertner, 1922 to 1924 from Seattle; since 1924, by E.Eichmann.

Has church, 28 x 40, acquired in 1926, Cost--\$3800.

S: 94; C: 71; V: 16.

Washington State School for Deaf-Mutes at Vancouver and Oregon State School for Deaf-Mutes at Salem are served by this Missionary.

Preaching Stations : Olney, served by E.Doering; work resumed in 1926 by W.F.Georg, and served by him since; and, Seaside, begun by W.F.Georg in 1927 and served by him since.

Aberdeen: Begun by L.F.Brandes in 1917; from Olympia; from 1922 to (Hoquiam) 1923 by Brandes at Aberdeen; by H.J.Meyer, a few months (Cosmopolis) in 1923; by O.H.Moeller, since 1924.

Has combination Chapel-Parsonage, built in 1928, Cost--\$4000.

S: 93; C: 38; V: 5.

Breaching stations were Wishkah Valley, and Montesano.

Auburn: Begun by J.Huchthausen of Tacoma in 1912; and served by him until 1920; by O.Korsmeyer from Seattle, 1920 to 1921; by H.A.Engelbrecht from Puyallup, and Tacoma, from 1922 to 1926; by Theo. Brackman from Puyallup, 1926 to 1931; since 1931 by O.Winterstein at Auburn.

S: 66; C: 36.

Bellingham: Mother church at N.Bellingham, explored by H.Bohl, 1902; work begun by H.C.Hinz, 1902 to 1903; served by F.M.L.Nitz 1903 to 1907; by C.H.Weber, 1908 to 1910; by W.Schmook, 1910 to 1914; by F.M.L.Nitz since 1914, from Bellingham. Congregation disbanded and members joined the congregation in Bellingham, in 1925.

N.Bellingham church and parsonage built without outside help; upon disbanding buildings were sold to the County, and proceeds turned over to Church Extension Fund.

Bellingham begun by H.C.Hinz, 1903; served by Vicar J.N.

Rosenwinkel, 1903 to 1904; by Theo. G8eswein, 1904 to 1907; since 1908 by F.M.L.Nitz.

Has church, 30 x 42, since 1910; Cost--\$2900.

Has eight-room parsonage, since 1905; Cost--\$500.

Has school-room in basement of church; conducted from 1905 to 1926, by Pastor and Vicars A.Grabow, and O.Winterstein.

Places at one time served from this parish: Blaine, (Halls Prairie, B.C.), Haynie, Everson, Acme, Burlington, Mt.Vernon, Sedro-Woolley, Port Townsend, Port Angeles, Roche Harbor, Sumas.

Places now being served: Blaine, Clipper.

S: 194; C: 115; V: 22.

Self-sustaining since 1920.

Vicars employed: W.Janssen, Two months, 1903; J.N.Rosenwinkel, (Dr.J.N.Jahn) Porto Allegre, Brazil) 1903 to 1904; A.

Koelmorgen, 1904 to 1905; A.Grabow, 1919 to 1921; O.Winterstein, 1925 to 1926.

Chehalis: Work begun by K.Spanuth (Independent but formerly of Winlock : Missouri Synod) in 1914; served by J.Huchthausen from Tacoma, 1917 to 1919; by G.Obenhaus, 1919 to 1922; by W.F.Georg, 1922 to 1923; by A.Reese, 1923 to 1926; by R.Heins, 1926 to 1928; by J.Meissinger since 1928.

Has parsonage that serves as meeting place, acquired by us in 1929 for \$3500. S: 68; C: 45; V: 11.

Winlock: was served by same men as Chehalis, except that Heins served there until 1932; since 1932, Winlock is being served from Chehalis by J.Meissinger.

Has church and parsonage and school-house.

S: 101; C: 68; V: 21.

Dishman: Begun by W.R. Vandre and W.F. Georg in 1923; served by H. Schlesselmann, 1923 to 1929; by Student K.C. Muhly, 1929 to 1930; since 1930 by J.F. Merz.  
Has church, 30 x 50, built in 1924; Cost--\$2600.  
Has seven-room parsonage, built in 1928; Cost--\$3200.  
S: 237; C: 137; V: 33.

Endicott: Begun by F. Selle in 1887 and served by him and his successor, J. Ehlen; by C.J. Heuer in 1891 from Warren, Oregon; by F. Schoknecht in 1892; by F. Verwiebe, 1893 to 1895 from Spokane; by C.J. Heuer, after a vacancy, 1899 to 1900 from Genesee, Idaho and Endicott; by H.G. Schmelzer in 1901; by H.A.C. Paul, 1902 to 1906; by J.A. Duchow, 1906 to 1910; by A. Spieiss, 1911 to 1916; by A. Zimmer, 1917 to 1920; by H.C. Schulze, 1921 to 1930; since 1930 by A.W. Scholp.  
Moved into the city in 1921, and revived by W.F. Georg.  
Has church, 32 x 32, acquired in 1926; Cost--\$162.00.  
Has nine-room parsonage built in 1929; Cost--\$2500.00.  
Celebrated the 35th Anniversary in 1926. (1929.  
Became self-sustaining in 1922, but is again subsidized since  
Moscow, Ida., is a preaching station, served temporarily by  
S: 104; C: 73; V: 18. E. Brohm. c.r.m.

Everett: Begun by H.C. Ebeling in 1901; served by H.G. Schmelzer, 1902 to 1908; by H. Bohl, 1908 to 1918; by E.H. Brandt, 1918 to 1922; by W. Biel, 1922 to 1923; by M. Engel 1923 to 1927; since 1928 by F. Zehe.  
Has church, 30 x 60, built in 1904; Cost--\$2500.  
Has seven room parsonage and six-room teacherage; a well-equipped school in basement with an enrollment of 22 pupils.  
Teachers were H.G. Schmelzer and H. Bohl before 1917; W.C.O. Neill, 1917 to 1918; since 1918 by H.B. Mantey.  
Self-sustaining since 1910. S: 344; C: 250; V: 44.

Havillah: Work begun by the Missionary-at-large G. Toenjes in 1902. Served by F. Israel, 1905 to 1910; by J.A. Duchow, 1911 to 1916; by E.M. Heyner, 1916 to 1919; by E. Husmann, 1920 to 1922; by Theo. Eggers 1922 to 1923; by W.C. Steinmann, 1924 to 1926; by H.T. Schmidt, 1926 to 1930; since 1930 by H.C. Schulze.  
Has church, 28 x 48, built in 1927; Cost--\$1800.  
Has parsonage and equipped school, 18 x 28; not in operation at present. Became self-sustaining in 1916.  
S: 178; C: 80; V: 20.  
Preaching stations are Molsch; S: 119; C: 37; V: 17; and Oroville, S: 64; C: 9; V: 7.

Kennewick: Begun by E. Doering in 1902; served by Geo. Arkebauer from Yakima, 1903 to 1904; by H. Bohl, from Yakima, 1905 to 1907; by H. Brockmann, 1907 to 1912; by A. Woker, 1912 to 1917; by E.H. Kreidt, 1917 to 1920; by H.C. Messerli, 1920 to 1924; by M.C. Kauth since 1924.  
Has church, built in 1920; Cost--\$2000; school, 24 x 26; enrollment: 9. Pastor teaches.  
Has six-room parsonage, cement-blocks, built in 1920; Cost--\$4600.  
Self-sustaining since 1920. S: 150; C: 110; V: 35.



Longview: Begun by Georg in 1925 at Kelso and 1926 at Longview;  
(Kelso) A.W.Reese assisted from Winlock; served by H.Sporleder  
from 1926 to 1930; by Georg, 1930 to 1931; since 1931 by  
R.W.Rimbach.

Has Chapel-parsonage built in 1927; Cost--\$4000; new chapel,  
20 x 45, erected in 1932, \$1900.

S: 35; C: 23; V: 7.

Klickitat: Begun by Georg in 1924 and served by him till 1925; by  
J.Kempf, 1925 to 1928; by R.Tschirley since 1929.

Self-sustaining since 1926.

Buildings used owned by the Neils Lumber Co.

S: 112, C: 59; V: 15.

Marlin: Marlin begun by Student C.G.Mennicke and W.H.Koss in 1903;  
(Krupp) served by O.Fedder, 1903 to 1905; by J.Gihring, 1906 to

Ruff: 1917; (1917 to 1918 no records); by W.R.Vandre 1919 to  
1921; by P.Gross from Wenatchee, 1922 to 1924; by H.Brockmann,  
from Menno, 1924 to 1926; by A.W.Schelp, 1926 to 1930; since  
1930 by A.Grabow.

Has church, 22 x 30; six-room parsonage, since 1926; Cost--

\$750. Celebrated the 25th Anniversary in 1928. Was self-

sustaining in 1912, but was again subsidized since 1926.

Ruff, begun by the Ohio Synod, is served from Marlin.

S: 140; C: 84; V: 26.

Mt. Vernon: Explored in 1910 and worked regularly since 1920 by  
F.M.L.Nitz; served from Blaine by Theo. Brackmann, 1923 to

1925; by Nitz again from 1925 to 1927; by A.Eichman since 1927.

Has church, 21 x 52, in 1929, for \$3500; a five-room parsonage,  
built in 1929; Cost--\$2500.

S: 83; C: 44; V: 11.

Odessa: Begun by E.Doering about 1901. Served at first from

Menno- Endicott; by C.J.Beyerlein, resident pastor, 1902 to 1904;

Lamona: by C.Hereth; 1904 to 1908; by J.A.Schlichting, 1908 to  
1912; since 1913 by H.Brockmann.

Menno has church, 28 x 54, built in 1927, for \$2000; five-room  
parsonage, since 1902; Cost--\$800.

Lamona was begun by C.Hereth in 1906 and first served by a  
student named Starick (No further information on record), who

## CONCORDIA COLLEGE; PORTLAND, OREGON

The fourth convention of the Oregon and Washington District, assembled in Snohomish, Washington in 1904, was informed by Vice President P. Brand, of Pittsburgh, that the California and Nevada District intended to petition the General Body for an Institution on the Pacific Coast. Our District was asked to support the petition. The brethren here were of the opinion that such a school ought to be located in the Northwest. The committee elected to confer with the California brethren, consisting of W. Luessenhop, W. H. Behrens, Mr. G. Brandes, and A. Kuempel, proposed leaving the location of the school to the decision of the General Body. The California brethren were not ready to do that. The District Pastoral Conference, held in Portland, November, 1904, was consulted. This Body advised that the District president get in touch with the General president, Doctor F. Pieper, seeking his opinion, and that the Committee then put the matter before the Congregations of the District. Doctor Pieper favored the idea that this District, as well as the California District have its own school. The vote of the congregations resulted in the opening of our college in Portland on September 11, 1905, and the calling of F. W. J. Sylwester as Director of this institution. Trinity Congregation in Portland offered its former school for classroom purposes. Mr. and Mrs. Adolph Kuempel offered to remodel their house and thus provide a place for board and lodging of the students. The solemn and well attended opening service took place at Trinity Church on September 10, 1905. Professor Sylwester was at this service inducted into office. Sixteen students were enrolled, and the school was off to a promising start.

At the Convention in 1906 more machinery for the successful working of the institution was installed. A plot of ground, the present site, was bought for the price of \$2500., and in 1907 a building was erected for \$6000, into which the students moved early in 1908. For four years Professor and Mrs. Sylwester acted as Father and Mother to the family of boys. Thus far our District had conducted the affairs of this institution without help from the General Body. In 1911, the institution was offered to the General Body. The offer was not accepted. However, Synod agreed henceforth to pay the salaries of the teachers. L. Blankenbuehler was added to the Faculty in 1911. He had acted as Assistant Instructor from 1907 to 1909. When Blankenbuehler left our institution to follow the call of the St. Paul, Minn., Concordia, E. H. Brandt became his successor, in 1921; and in 1924, K. Lorenz became the third member of the teaching staff. Besides Blankenbuehler, the following men acted as Assistants for the given terms: Student A. Mueller--1909 to 1911; Student A. Fuerbringer--1922 to 1923; Student W. Bouman--1923 to 1924; C. Stephan, c.r.m.,--1925 to 1929.

In 1920, the attic was remodeled so as to provide sleeping quarters for the students. In 1921, the District with the active support of the L. E. S. built the present Gymnasium. Since 1923, the General Body has taken over the school and its financing. A new building was voted by the General Body in 1926, and again in 1929, which, for lack of funds, has not been erected thus far.



In 1930, the 25th Anniversary of our Concordia was celebrated on the Campus by a happy throng of Concordia's friends.
